PAY BACK

Our class is probably the most generous class in Wabash history, but there are many of us who have not made a gift to the College this fiscal year which ends on June 30. Equally important is the percentage of classmates who contribute to the College as these figures are used by many national ranking organizations. No gift to Wabash is too small, and we would like to lead all classes in the number of donors. Currently we have 65 donors out of 166 class members or 39%. Here are some numbers to consider:

If 18 more men contribute, then we hit the 50% mark.

If 26 more men contribute, then we hit the 55% mark

If 35 more men contribute, then we hit the 60% mark.

If 44 more men contribute, then we hit the two-thirds of the class or the 66% mark.

A donation to Wabash College to honor our 60th reunion for the Class of '66 will be historic, so please consider doing so in the very near future.
